Selection of a PhD holder with experience abroad.

The CAPES Global Network for Sustainable Development, Science and Health hereby announce this call for applications for Doctoral Scholarships with International Experience (DEE) for research and teaching activities in Postgraduate Programs within the CAPES-Global.Edu Program, CAPES Notice No. 13/2025. The Management Committee will be responsible for coordinating the selection process and announcing the results, according to the rules of the CAPES-Global.Edu Program.

1. PURPOSE AND TARGET AUDIENCE

- 1.1. The Doctoral Program with Experience Abroad (DEE) aims to encourage the **attraction of researchers**. We are looking for Brazilian or foreign PhD holders **residing abroad** with international experience to develop activities in Brazil, within Graduate Programs (PPGs) associated with the Strategic Themes (TEs) of the CAPES Global Network for Sustainable Development, Science and Health. It is expected that the work of these PhD holders will contribute to knowledge exchange and stimulate academic environments with greater cultural and scientific diversity, fostering actions that positively impact the quality of graduates and the development of research in postgraduate studies.
- 1.2. The following Higher Education and Research Institutions (HEIs) are part of the **CAPES Global Network for Sustainable Development, Science and Health**: Oswaldo Cruz Foundation (**Fiocruz**), Federal University of Mato Grosso do Sul (**UFMS**), Federal University of Western Pará (**UFOPA**), Federal University of Piauí (**UFPI**), Federal University for Latin American Integration (**UNILA**) and Federal University of Rondônia (**UNIR**).
- 1.3. The **Young Talent with International Experience** scholarship aims to attract and encourage talented young researchers, whether Brazilian or foreign, **residing abroad** and with outstanding scientific or technological output, to settle in Brazil and carry out activities in the country.
- 1.4. The **Post-Doctoral with International Experience** scholarship aims to attract Brazilian or foreign researchers or professors residing abroad who have significant academic and scientific experience abroad (such as a full doctorate or post-doctorate for at least twelve months) to carry out academic and scientific activities in Brazil.
- 1.5. Permanent faculty members accredited in Graduate Programs linked to the Strategic Themes of the CAPES Global Network for Sustainable Development, Science and Health, with a formal employment relationship with the participating HEIs/IPs, as listed in Annex I, may submit proposals for this call.
- 1.6. The proposing professor will be responsible for the professor's or researcher's application, ensuring compliance with the requirements outlined in the call for proposals.



- 1.7. Each **candidate/applicant**, affiliated with one of the six participating institutions of the CAPES Global Network for Sustainable Development, Science and Health, **may register in only one (1) of the six available calls for applications**. It is mandatory that the candidate **chooses only one category to compete in**, in order to guarantee the equitable distribution of opportunities. **Attention: if the candidate registers in more than one call for applications, all of their registrations will be automatically canceled and considered null, without exception.**

2. ABOUT SCHOLARSHIPS AND BENEFITS

- 2.1 Up to **5 (five) Doctoral Scholarships with Experience Abroad** will be offered, including **2 Young Talent scholarships** which may last **6 (six) and 9 (nine) months**, and **3 Post-Doctoral scholarships lasting 10 (ten) months**, according to the option to be indicated at the time of registration, as per the table below. The scholarships are distributed among the five **Strategic Themes (TE)**, as shown in the tables below:

- 2.2 The objectives of each Strategic Theme, the Postgraduate Programs linked to these Themes, and the strategic Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) for each Theme are presented in **Annex I**.
- 2.3 At the time of registration, the candidate must **choose one (01)** of the five Strategic Themes, considering the respective work plan, the objectives of the TE and the Postgraduate Programs (PPGs) linked to it, as set out in Annex I, as well as the duration of the scholarship.
- 2.4 The following items are eligible for funding under the Young Talent and Post-Doctoral Fellowships with Experience Abroad programs, according to the values stipulated in [CAPES Ordinance No. 1, of January 3, 2020](#), and [CAPES Ordinance No. 33, of February 16, 2023](#):
- Monthly stipend** to cover the scholarship recipient's living expenses related to activities in Brazil;
 - Travel Assistance**, intended to contribute to the expenses of purchasing round-trip airline tickets in economy class at a promotional fare, to be paid in the currency used in Brazil;
 - Installation Allowance**, to contribute to the initial accommodation expenses of the scholarship recipient in Brazil, paid in a single installment at the beginning of the grant;
 - Assistance** for contracting **health insurance** with coverage in Brazil, according to the values mentioned in the aforementioned Ordinance, Annex IV, Table 2. Receiving health insurance assistance by foreign scholarship recipients implies the mandatory contracting of health



insurance valid for the entire period of their stay in Brazil. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in the full return of the amount received for this purpose, according to current CAPES regulations.

- 2.5 The amounts listed in subparagraphs "a" through "d" of item 2.4 will be deposited by CAPES directly into the scholarship recipient's bank account.
- 2.6 The period of activities should always begin on the first day of the month in which the scholarship starts and end on the last day of the month in which the scholarship ends.
- 2.7 CAPES and the CAPES Global Network for Sustainable Development, Science and Health will not cover any costs other than those described in item 2.4.
- 2.8 The Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) of the CAPES Global Network for Sustainable Development, Science and Health and CAPES are not responsible for expenses related to the payment of administrative and academic fees (tuition fees) and research (benchmark fees), as well as not providing assistance for companions or dependents.
- 2.9 The existence of a public health system in the destination country does not exempt the scholarship recipient from the responsibility of obtaining health insurance. If the expense for acquiring health insurance is not proven, the benefit must be returned to CAPES, updated according to applicable legislation.

3. REQUIREMENTS FOR APPLICATION

- 3.1 The candidate for the **Post-Doctoral** with experience abroad scholarship **must** meet the following requirements:
 - a) Being Brazilian or a foreigner **residing abroad**;
 - b) Having relevant **academic and scientific experience abroad**, a full PhD or Post-Doctorate **for at least 12 months**.
- 3.2 Candidates for the **Young Talent** with International Experience scholarship **must** meet the following requirements:
 - a) Being Brazilian or a foreigner **residing abroad**;
 - b) To have recognized competence as a researcher in their field of expertise;
 - c) Experience as a full master's or doctoral program, or a sandwich master's or doctoral program **exceeding twelve months**.
- 3.3 The **Postdoctoral or Young Talent** candidate must:
 - I. Have an **ORCID registration**, as it provides a unique identifier geared towards the academic and research field. Registration is free and can be done at <https://orcid.org/>;
 - II. Have relevant academic production in the last five years (2022 to 2026), related to the research area of the Postgraduate Program and to the objectives of the chosen Strategic Theme;
 - III. Not combine the scholarship allocated in this call for applications with other scholarships in Brazil originating from CAPES resources or from other federal, state, or municipal public administration bodies or entities;
 - IV. Indicate (on the application form) your language proficiency level. And submit a declaration of recognition of language fluency in Portuguese, Spanish, or English, dated and signed by the Brazilian supervisor (applicant), according to the model available in **Annex VI**.



- 3.4 The requirements for applying to this call for proposals are mandatory, and failure to comply with its provisions will result in the rejection of the application.
- 3.5 The **applicant** for a Postdoctoral or Young Talent position must be a faculty member with an employment relationship with the participating HEI/IP and working in one of the Graduate Programs that are part of the CAPES Global Network for Sustainable Development, Science and Health, with approval from the Graduate Program.
- 3.6 The applicant may submit a joint proposal with other graduate programs that are part of the CAPES Global Network for Sustainable Development, Science and Health, aiming to maximize efforts and make better use of resources. In this case, the proposal will have only one applicant program, but the participating programs will be explicitly stated in the work plan, along with the respective approvals of their coordinators.
- 3.7 The CAPES Global Network for Sustainable Development, Science and Health present a list of partner institutions in different countries that will be considered when distributing scholarships and analyzing applications. Consult the updated list of partner institutions in **Annex I**.
- 3.8 Priority will be given to candidates from countries included in the geopolitical concept of the **Global South**, that is, countries in Latin America, Africa, the Middle East (except Israel), Asia (excluding Japan and South Korea), and Oceania (excluding Australia and New Zealand); and member countries of the **BRICS+ group** (Russia, India, China, South Africa, Saudi Arabia, Egypt, United Arab Emirates, Ethiopia, Indonesia, and Iran).

4. FROM THE REGISTRATION

- 4.1 Submitting the proposal implies knowledge and acceptance, by the DEE candidate and the proposer, of the conditions of this call for proposals, of which they cannot claim ignorance.
- 4.2 The proposals submitted to compete for the scholarship must be properly aligned with the CAPES Global Network for Sustainable Development, Science and Health, as per Annex I.
- 4.3 **Only proposals submitted via the [electronic registration form will be accepted](#), with all information completed and the required documents in PDF format (without password), legible and in good viewing condition, submitted within the deadline of July 10th, 2026, until 4 PM (Brasilia time) on August 21st, 2026. Each candidate/proponent must submit only one registration, observing item 1.7, and gathering all the required documentation listed below :**
 - a. **Official photo identification document** for the foreign candidate. Copy of CPF (if applicable) or passport (if foreign);
 - b. Proof of **residence abroad**, such as water or electricity bills, among other documents that prove the candidate's place of residence;
 - c. **ORCID identifier** (Open Researcher and A valid taxpayer ID (Contributor ID) at the time of registration, to be entered directly on the registration form;
 - d. **Postdoctoral** candidates - Copy, front and back, of the **PhD diploma**. If the doctorate was not completed abroad, submit a certificate or declaration of Postdoctoral studies at a foreign institution, as defined by CAPES;
 - e. **Young Talent** candidates - Copy, front and back, of **Master's or Doctorate diploma** obtained abroad. Or proof of having completed a Sandwich Master's or Doctorate program



abroad for more than twelve months, as defined by CAPES;

- f. **Curriculum Vitae** of the DEE scholarship applicant, in Portuguese, English, or Spanish, with data from the last 5 years (2022 to 2026), highlighting the 5 most relevant publications, with a maximum of 5 pages;
- g. **Letter of acceptance**, signed by the candidate for the DEE scholarship, as per **Annex V**;
- h. **Lattes Curriculum** of the proposing professor and/or **researcher**, to be provided directly on the registration form;
- i. A **statement from the proposing professor**, duly dated and signed, on the Brazilian institution's letterhead, approving the work plan and indicating the month/year of the start and end of the internship in Brazil, within the period allowed by CAPES, according to the schedule, following the model in **Annex VII**;
- j. **Declaration of recognition of linguistic fluency** in Portuguese, Spanish, or English, dated and signed by the supervisor/proponent in Brazil, according to the model available in **Annex VI**;
- k. **Letter of awareness and approval from the PPG Coordination of the proposing professor** must express acceptance of the application and interest in receiving the Post-doctoral or Young Talent fellow, as per **Annex IV**. The same model may be used by other graduate programs participating in the proposal, if any.
- l. **Activity Plan** (see Annex II template), with a maximum of 5 (five) pages, in Portuguese or English, prepared by mutual agreement between the candidate and the proposer, in Times New Roman font, size 12, in PDF format, aligned with the objective of one of the Strategic Themes, including, obligatorily, the following items:
 - I. **Proposal identification** – Project title; Strategic theme associated with the Network to which the Graduate Program is linked; Higher Education Institution and Graduate Program of the proposing professor; Graduate Programs associated with the proposal, if any; International Institution of the Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering; Scholarship modality (Post- doc or Young Talent); number of months of the scholarship.
 - II. **Summary** of the Work Plan highlighting the objectives and goals to be achieved;
 - III. **Objectives**, with a clear definition and delimitation of the object of study, highlighting the specific objectives related to the study and activities to be carried out at the institution participating in the Network;
 - IV. **Methodology** to be used for the development of the international cooperation project;
 - V. Description of previous relationships with the institution, including joint research projects, supervisions, agreements, joint publications, and other previously established international collaboration initiatives (if applicable);
 - VI. **Justification of the activities**, presenting the merit, originality, timeliness, and relevance of the proposed activities in relation to the Network's objectives;
 - VII. **Potential impacts** of bringing in a PhD with international experience to strengthen the internationalization of the Network's Postgraduate Programs and to increase strategic international partnerships;
 - VIII. Description of the **availability of experimental or laboratory infrastructure** for the execution of the plan, when applicable;



- IX. **Results and products** that may be obtained from the development of the proposal, including potential academic, technical/artistic intellectual productions, supervision/joint supervision;
- X. **Schedule** of activities, compatible with the duration of the scholarship;
- XI. **Bibliographic references.**

- 4.4 The information provided is the sole responsibility of the applicant and the candidate.
- 4.5 **The start and end dates of activities** indicated in the application documents must correspond to the same period, in **month/year format**, consistent with the duration of the scholarship. If there are discrepancies, the Network or CAPES may request document correction.
- 4.6 The Network will not be held responsible for registrations not received within the deadline due to any technical problems, congestion of communication lines, or other factors that prevent data transfer.
- 4.7 Proposals that are not finalized by the registration deadline will be excluded from the selection process.
- 4.8 **Candidates/applicants who have registered for more than one call for proposals will have all their registrations automatically canceled and considered null, without exception.**
- 4.9 Conditional, late, or postal, fax, or email applications will not be accepted.
- 4.10 Additional documents and information may be requested by Fiocruz or CAPES at any time to better guide the process and implement the scholarship.
- 4.11 All communications related to this Call for Applications will be conducted via the email address provided by the applicant during registration.

5. FROM THE SELECTION

- 5.1 The selection process will be governed by this Call for Proposals and executed by the Committees of each Strategic Theme, with the support of the Administrative Committee of the CAPES Global Network for Sustainable Development, Science and Health.
- 5.2 The evaluation committee will be composed of the coordinators and representatives of the HEIs that are part of the Program's thematic committee, in each Strategic Theme, with the support of the Administrative Committee of the CAPES Global Network for Sustainable Development, Science and Health.
- 5.3 **Analysis and judgment:**
 - 5.3.1 **Technical Analysis / Approval of Applications:**
 - a) Meeting the registration requirements by the scheduled selection date;
 - b) The suitability of the documentation submitted by the candidate to the requirements of this Call for Applications.
 - 5.3.2 **Merit analysis:** The analysis of applications will be carried out considering merit criteria, with a maximum score of up to 100 (one hundred) points, distributed accordingly.

- 5.4 In case of a tie, the following will be considered successively:
- highest score in Block 3;
 - highest score in Block 1;
 - highest score in Block 2;
 - Candidate age, with preference given to older candidates.
- 5.5 The results of each stage of the selection process will be published in a list, organized by Strategic Theme and in descending order of scores, on the [Fiocruz Virtual Campus](#), and each institution linked to the CAPES Global Network for Sustainable Development, Science and Health will share these results.
- 5.6 Appeals and/or requests for reconsideration of the result must be submitted by sending **Annex VIII**, duly completed and signed by the candidate via gov.br, to the email address redes.capesglobal@fiocruz.br, within the deadline established in the schedule of this call for applications. The wording of the appeal request must be clear, concise, specific, and objective.
- 5.7 Upon completion of all stages of the selection process and the review of appeals, according to the schedule, the selected candidates will be notified via the email address provided in the electronic form, receiving instructions for the implementation of the scholarship.

Sole paragraph: This Call for Proposals has been adapted to the CAPES calendar, as published in **Circular Letter No. 5/2026-DRI/CAPES, dated May 6, 2026**. Please note that this calendar may be subject to change in order to adapt to any subsequent changes that CAPES may make.

7. DATA PROTECTION

- 7.1. The procedures for processing personal data requested during this selection process will be carried out in accordance with current and applicable Brazilian legislation on the protection of personal data, in this case, Law No. 13.709 of August 14, 2018 (LGPD), as well as in accordance with other related legislation and the provisions of this call for applications.
- 7.2. For the purposes of this selection process, all documents submitted/shared will be considered documents that may reveal information about the students, and will always be treated as if they contained personal data.
- 7.3. For all intents and purposes, all personal data published on platforms where academic profiles are created (e.g., Lattes Platform, ORCID, etc.) will be considered as made public by the data subject and may be consulted during the selection process, when applicable.
- 7.4. The Network will take reasonable systemic and administrative measures, commensurate with the risks, to ensure the security of personal information against interference, misuse, loss, unauthorized access, destruction, or disclosure.
- 7.5. The candidate's personal data will be deleted from the systems of the participating HEIs of the Network upon request from the candidate, or when it is no longer necessary for the purposes of this call for applications, unless there is any legal basis for its maintenance, as stipulated by the LGPD in Section IV of its Chapter II.
- 7.6. By registering, the candidate declares to be aware of and in agreement with the processing of their personal data, which will be used exclusively for the execution and management of this selection process, and may also be shared, when necessary, with funding agencies and other HEIs of the Network directly involved in the selection process and operation of the funded items, in accordance with the legislation applicable to the protection of personal data.

8. REGARDING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM WITH CAPES



- 8.1 It is the scholarship recipient's responsibility to request registration in the Individual Taxpayer Registry (CPF), managed by the Brazilian Federal Revenue Service (RFB), so that they can access the CAPES Scholarship and Grant Control System (SCBA), if they do not already have one.
- 8.2 Once the candidate has their CPF (Brazilian Individual Taxpayer Registry number), they must register in the SCBA/CAPES system (<http://scba.capes.gov.br/scba>). The proposing professor must monitor the process and inform, via email redes.capesglobal@fiocruz.br, when the registration is complete, or if the Visiting Professor is already registered in the SCBA.
- 8.3 Only after receiving the completed registration in the CAPES system will the Management Committee/Administrative Committee implement the selected and approved candidates in the CAPES Scholarship and Grant Control System (SCBA), according to the scholarship implementation schedule established by CAPES.
- 8.4 The applicant is responsible for correctly providing their email address at the time of registration, as well as for regularly checking their inbox, including the spam or junk mail folder. CAPES will send official communications, including information regarding the approval or rejection of the application, to the email address provided, using the sender: sistema.comunicador@capes.gov.br.
- 8.5 After registration and implementation of the scholarship at CAPES, the candidate's process becomes their responsibility, and the Management Committee/Administrative Committee cannot send messages or documents to resolve problems or questions.
- 8.6 All communications and questions after registration with CAPES will be handled by the candidate directly with CAPES through the Direct Line system (<http://linhadireta.capes.gov.br>).
- 8.7 In the absence of acceptance or rejection of the scholarship, the approved candidate will be considered to have withdrawn and the scholarship will be cancelled after the deadline set by CAPES.
- 8.8 **The grant letter and the Award Agreement will be issued by CAPES after receiving acceptance of the scholarship.** The scholarship will only be considered implemented after the candidate has sent CAPES the aforementioned documents signed by the applicant.
- 8.9 During the scholarship period, any changes related to the execution of activities must be requested by the scholarship recipient to CAPES, via the Direct Line system, with due justification. These requests must have the approval of the Graduate Program, the Management Committee/Administrative Committee, and the Strategic Theme Coordinator, and will be analyzed by CAPES to verify the feasibility of the change.
- 8.10 If inconsistencies or irregularities are found in the documents and information submitted, CAPES may cancel the grant, based on the documentary inconsistency.
- 8.11 The granting of a scholarship will be prohibited to any approved candidate who is in default with CAPES or the Public Administration.
- 8.12 Accepting the scholarship through the Capes system implies knowledge and acceptance of the rules and conditions established in this Call for Proposals and applicable legislation, which the candidate cannot claim to be unaware of or disagree with.
- 8.13 Acceptance of the scholarship by the candidate must be completed within the deadlines and in accordance with the rules established by CAPES.



- 8.14 The start of the scholarship recipient's activities should coincide with the period of academic activity at the Brazilian institution.
- 8.15 During their stay in Brazil, scholarship recipients must be involved in academic activities, under penalty of suspension or cancellation of the scholarship.
- 8.16 The scholarship recipient must maintain regular immigration status in Brazil throughout the program.
- 8.17 **The use of a tourist visa is not permitted for the purpose of receiving a scholarship.**
- 8.18 It is the responsibility of the DEE scholarship recipient to take the necessary steps to obtain an entry visa to Brazil, in the category corresponding to the activities they will be developing, with a validity compatible with the period of stay in Brazil, including the possibility of extending the contract, in accordance with current legislation. In this regard, all those coming to Brazil to develop academic activities, courses, give lectures, or conduct research activities must contact the Brazilian Consulate in their country of origin before traveling and, above all, comply with Brazilian legislation for remaining in the national territory. This requirement is fundamental for CAPES accountability.
- 8.19 To arrange for the opening of a checking account at any Brazilian bank.
- 8.20 Any extension of the stay in Brazil that exceeds the scholarship period must be requested from CAPES and, when authorized, will occur **without cost to CAPES**.
- 8.21 If the scholarship recipient postpones their arrival date in Brazil, they must notify CAPES immediately.
- 8.22 During the validity of the CAPES-Global.Edu Program, the Brazilian applicant assumes the responsibility of sending to the Strategic Theme Coordination any publications and other products resulting from this mobility.

9. REGARDING THE RETURN OF THE SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENT, DISSEMINATION, AND VISIBILITY

- 9.1. Upon returning, the former scholarship recipient must submit all necessary accountability documents to CAPES through the SCBA system, such as proof of boarding for airline tickets, health insurance policy, and activity report, in order to avoid default with CAPES.
- 9.2. The process will be finalized in the Monitoring Sector and forwarded to the Alumni Sector (CAEE) of CAPES, at which point the scholarship recipient must submit the documentation related to the accountability report for their return.
- 9.3. The former scholarship recipient's communications will continue through the Linha Direta platform.
- 9.4. The scholarship recipient must inform CAPES if the research results or the final report itself have commercial value or could lead to the development of a product or method involving the establishment of a patent.
- 9.5. All products, works produced, and published resulting from this mobility must be reported by the scholarship recipient via email to rededocapessglobal@fioacruz.br.
- 9.6. The proposing professor, within a maximum period of 30 (thirty) days from the conclusion of the activities carried out, must send, electronically, to the address rededocapessglobal@fioacruz.br, a detailed report of the activities developed with the host institution. This **report must include, obligatorily**, a description of the courses, training sessions, lectures or seminars attended,

participation in events, publications or other academic products developed in cooperation with the HEI, as well as the activities performed and the results achieved. The respective certificate or declaration of completion and approval of the course must also be attached.

- 9.7. During the scholarship period, the recipient of funding from the CAPES-Global.edu Program must provide the **CAPES Global Network for Sustainable Development, Science and Health** with material intended for the institutional dissemination of the results obtained from their international experience.
- 9.8. To this end, the scholarship recipient must sign the **Agreement Form**, which will be sent to the selected candidate in due course, authorizing the use of the material by CAPES and the **CAPES Global Network for Sustainable Development, Science and Health** in institutional communication channels, such as social networks and websites. The material to be provided must include:
 - a) **A video** with a maximum duration of 60 (sixty) seconds and a size **not exceeding 25 MB**, reporting on the international experience, the results obtained and the resulting impacts (scientific, social, etc.);
 - b) **A text** in a Word file, limited to 5 (five) sentences, describing the international experience, the results obtained, and the resulting impacts. The document must include the full name of the professor, the institution of affiliation, the position held, and a profile photo in JPEG or JPG format.
- 9.9. When publicizing any actions or results related to the Network, within the scope of the CAPES-Global.edu Program, the scholarship recipient must mention the funding granted by CAPES.
- 9.10. During the duration of the CAPES Global Program, the Brazilian applicant assumes the responsibility of sending any publications and other products resulting from this mobility to the Strategic Theme Coordination.
- 9.11. According to CAPES Ordinance No. 206, of September 4, 2018, the scholarship recipient must include in all works produced or published, in any media, that result from activities financed, in whole or in part, by CAPES, the following expressions, in the language of the work: "*O presente trabalho foi realizado com apoio da Coordenação de Aperfeiçoamento de Pessoal de Nível Superior - Brasil (CAPES) - Código de Financiamento 001*" / "This study was financed in part by Coordination for the Improvement of Higher Education Personnel - Brazil (CAPES) - Finance Code 001".

10. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 10.1 The replacement of the beneficiary or the transfer of the scholarship to another Visiting Professor in Brazil is prohibited.
- 10.2 Submitting the proposal implies knowledge and acceptance by the candidate of the Regulations for scholarships abroad or subsequent normative acts governing the subject matter and conditions of this Call for Proposals, of which they cannot claim ignorance.
- 10.3 Omitted or exceptional cases will be analyzed by the Management Committee/Theme Coordinators.

- 10.8 This Call for Proposals will follow the scholarship allocation schedule provided by CAPES and is therefore subject to changes resulting from changes in the opening dates of the CAPES system.
